U.S. Air Force Fact Sheet CALLSIGN "APPLE 1"

Before it was converted from an HH-53, the MH-53M (serial number 68-10357) on display took part in the Son Tay Raid -- one of the most famous combat actions of the Southeas Asia War. Flown by Lt. Col. Warner A. Britton under the callsign "Apple 1," it carried the mission's "command element" on the missic to rescue American prisoners of war though to be held at the Son Tay prison near Hano North Vietnam.



On the night of Nov. 20-21, 1970, American assault teams made the dangerous flightto North Vietnam, and this helicopter mistakenly offloaded its assault forces at an enemy backs about 500 yards from the prison.
